LAND ACKNOWLEDGEMENT

"We are gathering on lands that have been home to First Nations Peoples from time immemorial. We acknowledge that what we now call Richmond Hill is on the Treaty Lands and Territory of the Mississaugas of the Credit First Nation and the Mississauga and Chippewa Nations of the Williams Treaty. We also recognize that we are on part of the traditional territories of the Haudenosaunee and the Huron Wendat.

We would also like to acknowledge all First Nation, Inuit and Métis peoples from across North America, also known as Turtle Island, who now reside in the City of Richmond Hill. We are committed to rebuilding constructive and cooperative relationships."



ABOUT WARD I OAK RIDGES

Oak Ridges is a community of Richmond Hill and has been part of the city since 1971. It forms the northern portion of the municipality's boundary, where it borders Aurora.

Oak Ridges is wholly situated on the Oak Ridges Moraine, much of the terrain is hilly, with pine forests and small creeks still prospering in the east and southwest.

History of Oak Ridges

The earliest Iroquoian site (A.D. 1280-1320) in Richmond Hill documented by archaeologists is situated on the east side of Lake Wilcox. The village appears to have had at least five longhouses, large structures constructed of cedar saplings and rendered with cedar or elm bark. Village residents hunted deer and harvested fish, mostly perch, from Lake Wilcox. There seems to have been a focus on the exploitation of bush honeysuckle, perhaps for medicinal purposes. The Wilcox Lake Site is the earliest Iroquoian village identified to date in York Region

Oak Ridges was established along Yonge Street in 1799 by Joseph Geneviève and a group of French Royalists, who were granted land to settle by the British government. It was originally named Windham in honour of Geneviève's friend William Windham, Secretary at War for Britain at the time. Geneviève soon departed to search for another site to settle, and by 1840 the settlement and the area from the King-Vaughan town line to the 15th sideroad became known as Oak Ridges.

ABOUT THE CITY OF RICHMOND HILL

The City of Richmond Hill is located in Southern Ontario, Canada, in the central part of York Region. It has a growing population of over 202,022 (2021 Census) residents and covers approximately 100 square kilometres.

The City was officially incorporated as a village and the first Council Meeting was held in January 1873 under the leadership of Abraham Law as Reeve. Richmond Hill developed because of its proximity to Toronto, as farmers came into City on their way to Toronto markets and people travelled up and down Yonge Street to and from communities further north.

The municipality has a wide purview relating to the interests of the municipality and its residents to develop and maintain policies, practices and procedures through the issuing of bylaws relating to roads, waste management, property standards, public utilities, culture, parks, recreation and heritage, drainage and flood control, parking, animals, economic development and the licensing of business.

The city is also responsible for maintaining its finances in order to provide relevant services and for maintaining an official plan to guide development.





ABOUT THE REGIONAL MUNICIPALITY OF YORK

The Regional Municipality of York stretches north from Toronto to Lake Simcoe and includes many hectares of protected Greenbelt. York Region's diversity is evident in our nine local municipalities, geography, economic development and population.

Organized as a two-tier municipal government structure, The Regional Municipality of York is responsible for providing services to all regional residents and businesses, while each local municipality provides additional services.

Public transit, water management, emergency medical services and policing are handled by York Region, while waste and recycling collection, parks and recreation, libraries and others are the responsibility of the city or town.



Richmond Hill Fire and Emergency Services

<u>Richmond Hill Fire and Emergency Services</u> (RHFES) provide fire, medical and rescue services to the citizens of Richmond Hill. They are committed to protecting the lives and property of our community through excellence in prevention, education, training and emergency response.

RHFES staff work 24 hours a day, 7 days a week to help keep our community safe. **The Fire Station in Oak Ridges is located at 13067 Yonge Street.**

Police

York Regional Police (YRP) employs more than 1,500 officers and 600 civilians and is recognized as a national leader in law enforcement and crime prevention programs.

If you need to speak with YRP about a nonemergency situation or to report a concern, you may contact the non-emergency line at **1-866-876-5423**.

Emergencies

Dial 911 any time there is a threat to life or property. This will connect you with police, fire and ambulance dispatch operators.

Operators have instant access to an interpreter through Language Line Services, so they can assist with calls in more than 150 languages, 24 hours a day.

GARBAGE AND RECYCLING AT YOUR HOME

Houses in Richmond Hill are provided with curbside collection for recycling (blue box), organics (green bin), garbage and yard waste.

Garbage is collected every second week, as shown in the <u>Waste</u> <u>Management Calendar</u>.

Collections in Oak Ridges are on Thursday.

- Recycling (blue box) weekly collection
- Organics (green bin) weekly collection
- Garbage and large items collection every other week
- Appliances collected monthly by appointment only



Garbage Tags and Bins

Richmond Hill's garbage limit is three items each garbage collection day. If you have more than three items you must use garbage tags for extra items to be collected.

• Garbage tags can be purchased in-person at the Operations Centre, any Richmond Hill Library or Community Centre.

New waste bins are available for in-person purchase at the Operations Centre and at the Main Municipal Offices.

Damaged or broken Richmond Hill labelled blue boxes (22 gallon only) and green bins (12 gallon only) can be exchanged for free at the Operations Centre only.

GETTING AROUND

Roads are maintained and improved regularly, assisting in the safe and efficient transport of goods and people between urban and rural locations.

York Region public transportation buses are also readily available, offering a convenient commute throughout York Region. There are also two GO Transit stations located in Oak Ridges with plenty of free parking.

Public Transportation

York Region is serviced by <u>York Region Transit</u> (<u>YRT</u>) and offers local and rapid transit options in all nine cities and towns.







YRT routes keep residents connected within York Region, and to transit services in the <u>City</u> of Toronto the Regions of Peel and <u>Durham</u>, <u>GO Transit</u> and beyond.


